









# School attendance in Australian school students with an intellectual disability

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#### **Previous research**



- Poor school attendance linked to negative outcomes: lower academic attainment, impaired social and emotional development, and early school drop-out
- Students with intellectual disability (ID) have lower school attainment and poorer post-school outcomes than their typically developing peers
- Limited research shows students with ID and / or autism (ASD)
  have more school absences than their typically developing
  peers








- Identify rates of school non-attendance in children with ID in the State of Victoria, Australia
- Establish the most common <u>reasons</u> for non-attendance and rates of <u>types</u> of problematic non-attendance
- 3. Informed by the Kids and Teens at School (KiTeS)
  Framework to understand factors associated with school (non)attendance







### **Methods**



- Caregivers of children with an ID enrolled in a primary or secondary school in state of Victoria (Australia) invited to participate and complete a questionnaire
- A total of 794 caregivers signed up to participate
  - 36 were ineligible
  - 125 withdrew or did not return the caregiver survey
  - 4 removed from analysis because attendance data from the child's school was not forthcoming
- Schools provided attendance data for preceding 20 school days, identifying days missed
- Parents completed measure on reasons for non-attendance (SNACK)



# School Non-Attendance Checklist (SNACK)

- a. Brief measure accounting for a range of possible types of absence: non-problematic (e.g., illness, funeral) and problematic (truancy, school refusal, school withdrawal, school exclusion)
- Reasons for non-attendance grouped by Child, Parent, Family,
   School, or Other factors
- c. Jargon free definitions supported by examples
- d. One month timeframe (20 school days)





#### My child:

- was sick
- had an appointment
- was reluctant or refused
- skipped/wagged/truanted





#### I or my partner:

- gave my child a day off
- kept my child home for other reasons
- arranged extra holidays





#### **Our family:**

- had an urgent situation
- had other difficulties
- had a religious holiday or cultural observance





#### The school:

- was closed
- sent my child home due to his/her behaviour
- asked that my child stay away from school





#### Other:

- weather conditions
- something else, please describe

## Sample recruited



N=629 caregivers/parents of children with an ID

Parents / caregivers	84.6% mothers
Child sex	410 male (65.2%)
Child age	M = 11.18 years ( <i>sd</i> =3.5) Range = 5-18 years
School type	559 special school 60 mainstream
Autism Spectrum Disorder (parent report)	312 (49.6%)

#### **Overall attendance**



#### **Conclusions**



- Just over 40% had full attendance during the 20 day period, although the sample attended for over 90% of the sessions
- 29.3% of children had problematic level of non-attendance (≥10%)
- Truancy and exclusion were rare
- Withdrawal (11.13%) and refusal (5.25%) the main school attendance problems
- <u>Sickness</u>, followed by having <u>appointments</u> (often for health reasons) were the main reasons for non-attendance; each child missing school for these reasons typically missed 3/20 days
- Examine correlates of attendance, informed by theory

- Child's connectedness and attitude to school
- Child's experiences of bullying victimisation
- Child's emotional and behavioural problems
- Child's adaptive behaviour and skills
- Parental values regarding education and engagement with school
- Parental mental health
- Family functioning
- Socio-economic disadvantage
- School type & location
- Method of Transport to school

- Reasons for absences using the SNACK (Heyne & Melvin, 2015)
- Parent-teacher relationship and communication
- Student-teacher relationship
- Student victimisation experiences
- Student's emotional and behavioural problems
- School climate
